Some data on migration processes in the world



- According to the International Organization for Migration (IOM):
  - There are **214 million** migrants in the world.
  - **USD 444,000 million** remittances per year.
  - About **40 million IDPs (internally displaced persons) and refugees**





These are the main destination countries for refugees



These are the main countries of origin for refugees







The West Bank Wall is causing a high number of IDPs according to the **International Displacement Monitoring Centre (IDMC)**


West Bank Wall - Map 2006

- We should also add the Kurdish Diaspora in Europe, mainly in **Germany, France, Holland, Switzerland and Britain**.



### FEMALE MIGRATION




—According to the UNFPA report "**State of World Population 2010**":

- About **40 million people** are vulnerable (IDPs, refugees, asylum seekers ...)
- In 2009, women and girls amounted to 47% of this figure (UNHCR)

#### FOR CONSIDERATION

- Most (about 3/5) of the **poorest 1,400 million people in the world** are women.
- Women account for 2/3 of adults who **cannot read or write** (960 million).
- 70% of **children who do not attend school** are girls (130 million).
- 536,000 women **die each year during pregnancy or childbirth**.
- Between 10 and 15 million women **suffer injury or illness**.
- 47% of the **world's refugees and asylum seekers**, over 50% of IDPs and over 51% of internally displaced returnees are women and children.
- In 2009, the ILO estimates that between 6.5% and 7.4% of those **unemployed were women**, compared to 6.1% and 7% for men. **Less secure, unpaid jobs** will mainly be covered by women.
- **2/3 of people with HIV/AIDS worldwide** are women from Sub-Saharan Africa.

- **Resolution 1325** (2000) on women, peace and security
  - Links peace and security with Women's Rights
- **Resolution 1820** (2008) on violence against women as a tactic of war
  - Prof. Sonia Hernández Pradas UCM
- **Resolution 1888** (2009) develops the above
  - Representative Margot Wallstrom
- **Resolution 1889** (2009) on the participation of women in peace processes, public life and conflict resolution

What does it show us about women?

According to UNESCO and UNICEF, education is the key to achieving MDGs




- **UNESCO** has carried out a study that confirms how **education is the basis for achieving the MDGs**.







### MDG3 WOMEN, INEQUALITY AND PRIMARY EDUCATION





### WOMEN AND ACHIEVING MDGs MDG4 WOMEN, EDUCATION AND CHILD MORTALITY







#### MDG5 HEALTH/MATERNAL MORTALITY




### Mortalidad materna por países (2005)



### WOMEN AND ACHIEVING MDGs MDG7 WOMEN, EDUCATION AND ACCESS TO DRINKING WATER





### Evolución de la asistencia mundial como porcentaje del ingreso nacional bruto (INB) de los países miembros del CAD



### EMPLOYMENT SITUATION OF WOMEN IN THE MENA REGION


#### ILO DATA

- **1,200 million** women did paid work outside the home in 2007.
- **81.6 million women are unemployed** in the world.
- For every **70 women in the workforce, there are 100 men**.
- **48% of women** of working age have a paid job in the world:



## NORTH AFRICA DATA

## NORTH AFRICA

- **Limited access to the world of work:** for every 100 men, only 35 women have access.
- Biggest "Gender gap" in the world according to the ILO.
- Only **2 out of every 10 women** of working age are professionally active.
- 15 million women as against 65 million men.
- In 2015 25% of the population will be **young people** of working age.
- Sectors:
  - 52.2% services
  - 32.6% agriculture
  - 15.2% industry



## MIDDLE EAST

- **Limited access to the world of work:** for every 100 men, only 39 women have access.
- **"Gender gap".**
- Only 2 out of every 10 women of working age are professionally active as against 4 out of every 10 men.
- Female unemployment around 50%.
- Sectors:
  - 50.2% services
  - 31.0% agriculture
  - 18.8% industry

  - INSTITUTIONALIZATION
  - ECONOMIC SECTOR
  - POLITICAL SYSTEM
  - WAR OR CONFLICT SITUATIONS

## SOME REFLECTIONS

### VULNERABILITY

- **The migration process creates weaknesses**, especially for women.
- The situation in the ME and NA is particularly delicate due to the presence of **vulnerable groups** such as refugees and displaced or stateless persons.
- **The situation of women is particularly sensitive**, the lack of access to **education** having been found to be a major source of vulnerability.
- **The employment status of women in the MENA region is worrying**, being behind other regions in the world.

## INTEGRATION PROCESS

- In order to overcome these vulnerabilities it is necessary to **work through human rights and an integration process** for both migrants and vulnerable groups.
- **Influencing factors** have been observed, such as culture, education or the presence of conflict.
- Agents of change have been observed: building human capabilities in social and cultural areas, human rights and institutional strengthening.
- **Education is the great engine of development** for women.
